12.3 Examination Centres

The Commission will endeavor to accommodate candidates at the Centres opted by them. However, the Commission reserves the right to add new Centre(s) of Examination in addition to the list of Centres, cancel any Centre from the list, and ask candidates who opted for that Centre to appear from another Centre. The Commission also reserves the right to divert candidates of one Centre to another Centre to conduct the examination.

13. Scheme of Examination

13.1 The Computer Based Examination will be conducted in two tiers:

- **13.1.1** Tier-I
- **13.1.2** Tier-II

13.2 If the Computer Based Examination is conducted in multiple shifts, marks will be normalized using the procedure published by the Commission vide Notice dated 02-06-2025. The normalized scores will be used to determine final merit and cut-off marks.

13.3 Tentative Answer Keys will be placed on the Commission's website after the Examination. Candidates may submit online representations within the stipulated time on payment of Rs. 50/- per question, which is non-refundable. Representations through letter, application, email or any other mode will not be entertained. The Final Answer Keys will be used for processing the result and will be uploaded after declaration of the result.

13.4 The Commission has published Guidelines regarding Challenge/Objection Management System vide Notice dated 10.04.2026. Candidates are advised to read the guidelines carefully.

13.5 The examination schedule is tentative. Any change in schedule or other examination information will be communicated only through the Commission's website.

13.6 Metric systems of weights and measures will be used wherever necessary.

13.7 There will be no provision for re-evaluation or re-checking of scores at any stage/Tier. No correspondence in this regard will be entertained.

13.8.1 Tier-I consists only of Objective Type, Multiple Choice Questions. Questions will be set in English, Hindi and the language opted by the candidate for Parts II, III and IV, as specified in Annexure-XV.

13.8.2 Negative marking of **0.50 marks** will apply for each wrong answer.

Scribe / Compensatory Time

Candidates eligible for a scribe under Para 7.1, 7.2 and 7.3 receive the specified compensatory time. In Tier-II, the extended timings are: Section-I 1 hour 20 minutes (30+10 minutes per subject), Section-II 1 hour 20 minutes (55 minutes English + 25 minutes General Awareness), Section-III 20 minutes, and the applicable Skill/Typing Test receives the additional compensatory time specified in the examination scheme.

13.9.1 Tier-II includes four sections: Section-I (Mathematical Abilities; Reasoning and General Intelligence), Section-II (English Language and Comprehension; General Awareness), Section-III (Computer Knowledge Test), and Section-IV (Skill Test/Typing Test).

13.9.2 Tier-II is conducted in two sessions on the same day. Session-I includes Sections I, II and III; Session-II includes Section IV.

13.9.3 Session-I has a total duration of 2 hours 15 minutes.

13.9.4 Section-I has two parts and one hour is allotted. It automatically closes after one hour.

13.9.5 Section-II begins immediately after Section-I and lasts one hour. It automatically closes after one hour.

13.9.6 Section-III begins immediately after Section-II and lasts 15 minutes. Session-I ends after Section-III.

13.9.7 After Session-I, candidates receive a break for re-registration for Session-II.

13.9.8 Session-II consists of Section-IV, the Skill Test/Typing Test.

13.9.9 Candidates must qualify all sections of Tier-II.

13.9.10 Tier-II is objective/multiple-choice except Section-IV. Questions are set in English, Hindi and the opted language as specified in Annexure-XV, except Part-A (English Language and Comprehension) of Section-II.

13.9.11 Negative marking of **1 mark** applies for each wrong answer in Sections I, II and III.

13.9.12 Section-III (Computer Knowledge Test) is mandatory but qualifying in nature.

13.9.13 Section-IV: Skill Test / Typing Test

Section-IV is conducted during Session-II on the same day and is qualifying in nature. Evaluation is carried out according to the Commission's applicable evaluation guidelines. Errors in the Skill Test are calculated up to two decimal places.

Skill Test for Data Entry Operator (DEO)

- **Part A - DEO / DEO Grade 'A' in the Department/Ministry specified in Para 8.1:** 15,000 key depressions per hour. Duration: 15 minutes. The passage contains approximately 3,700-4,000 key depressions.
- **Part B - DEO / DEO Grade 'A' in other Departments/Ministries:** 8,000 key depressions per hour. Duration: 15 minutes. The passage contains approximately 2,000-2,200 key depressions.
- The Skill Test is mandatory for Data Entry Operators; no candidate is exempted from appearing.
- Candidates eligible for a scribe receive 5 minutes compensatory time; the Skill Test duration becomes 20 minutes.

Typing Test for LDC / JSA

- The candidate must choose either Hindi or English as the typing medium in the online application. The choice is final.

- **English:** 35 words per minute (approximately 10,500 key depressions per hour).
- **Hindi:** 30 words per minute (approximately 9,000 key depressions per hour).
- Typing speed is assessed through accuracy while typing a given passage for 10 minutes.
- Candidates eligible for a scribe receive 5 minutes compensatory time; the test duration becomes 15 minutes.
- Passage Dictators will be provided to eligible visually handicapped candidates who have opted for a scribe.
- Eligible persons with disabilities who are certified by the competent Medical Authority as permanently unable to type may seek exemption, subject to the prescribed medical certificates and conditions.
- Candidates choosing Hindi as the typing/skill-test medium for LDC/JSA must use **Mangal Font**. Use of another font leads to non-qualification.

13.10 Indicative Syllabus - Tier-I

13.10.1 English Language

Spot the Error; Fill in the Blanks; Synonyms/Homonyms; Antonyms; Spellings and detection of mis-spelt words; Idioms & Phrases; One Word Substitution; Improvement of Sentences; Active/Passive Voice; Direct/Indirect Narration; Shuffling of Sentence Parts; Shuffling of Sentences in a Passage; Cloze Passage; Comprehension Passage.

13.10.2 General Intelligence

Questions may be of verbal and non-verbal types and may include Semantic Analogy, Symbolic Operations, Symbolic/Number Analogy, Trends, Figural Analogy, Space Orientation, Semantic Classification, Venn Diagrams, Symbolic/Number Classification, Drawing Inferences, Figural Classification, Punched Hole/Pattern Folding & Unfolding, Semantic Series, Figural Pattern Folding and Completion, Number Series, Embedded Figures, Figural Series, Critical Thinking, Problem Solving, Emotional Intelligence, Word Building, Social Intelligence, Coding and Decoding, Numerical Operations and other related sub-topics.

13.10.3 Quantitative Aptitude

- **Number Systems:** Computation of whole numbers, decimals and fractions; relationship between numbers.
- **Fundamental Arithmetical Operations:** Percentages; Ratio and Proportion; Square Roots; Averages; Simple and Compound Interest; Profit and Loss; Discount; Partnership Business; Mixture and Alligation; Time and Distance; Time and Work.
- **Algebra:** Basic algebraic identities of school algebra; elementary surds (simple problems); graphs of linear equations.
- **Geometry:** Elementary geometric figures and facts; triangle and its various centres; congruence and similarity of triangles; circle and its chords, tangents and angles subtended by chords; common tangents to two or more circles.
- **Mensuration:** Triangle; quadrilaterals; regular polygons; circle; right prism; right circular cone; right circular cylinder; sphere; hemispheres; rectangular parallelepiped; regular right pyramid with triangular or square base.
- **Trigonometry:** Trigonometric ratios; complementary angles; height and distances (simple problems); standard identities such as $\sin^2\theta + \cos^2\theta = 1$.
- **Statistical Charts:** Tables and graphs including histogram, frequency polygon, bar diagram and pie chart.

13.10.4 General Awareness

Questions are designed to test general awareness of the environment around the candidate and its application to society, along with knowledge of current events and everyday observation and experience in their scientific aspect. Questions may relate to India and its neighbouring countries, especially History, Culture, Geography, Economic Scene, General Policy and Scientific Research.

13.10.5 For VH candidates with 40% and above visual disability, there will be no component of Maps/Graphs/Diagrams/Statistical Data in the General Intelligence and Quantitative Aptitude parts.

13.11 Indicative Syllabus - Tier-II

13.11.1 Mathematical Abilities

- **Number Systems:** Computation of whole numbers, decimals and fractions; relationship between numbers.
- **Fundamental Arithmetical Operations:** Percentages; Ratio and Proportion; Square Roots; Averages; Simple and Compound Interest; Profit and Loss; Discount; Partnership Business; Mixture and Alligation; Time and Distance; Time and Work.
- **Algebra:** Basic algebraic identities of school algebra; elementary surds (simple problems); graphs of linear equations.
- **Geometry:** Elementary geometric figures and facts; triangle and its various centres; congruence and similarity of triangles; circle and its chords, tangents and angles subtended by chords; common tangents to two or more circles.

13.11.2 Reasoning and General Intelligence

Questions may be verbal and non-verbal and may include Semantic Analogy, Symbolic Operations, Symbolic/Number Analogy, Trends, Figural Analogy, Space Orientation, Semantic Classification, Venn Diagrams, Symbolic/Number Classification, Drawing Inferences, Figural Classification, Punched Hole/Pattern Folding & Unfolding, Semantic Series, Figural Pattern Folding and Completion, Number Series, Embedded Figures, Figural Series, Critical Thinking, Problem Solving, Emotional Intelligence, Word Building, Social Intelligence, Coding and Decoding, Numerical Operations and other related sub-topics.

13.11.3 English Language and Comprehension

Vocabulary, grammar, sentence structure, synonyms, antonyms and their correct usage; Spot the Error; Fill in the Blanks; Synonyms/Homonyms; Antonyms; Spellings and detection of mis-spelt words; Idioms & Phrases; One Word Substitution; Improvement of Sentences; Active/Passive Voice; Direct/Indirect Narration; Shuffling of Sentence Parts; Shuffling of Sentences in a Passage; Cloze Passage; Comprehension Passage. Two or more paragraphs may be given for comprehension-based questions. At least one paragraph may be a simple passage based on a book or story, while another may be based on a current-affairs editorial or report.

13.11.4 General Awareness

Questions are designed to test general awareness of the environment and its application to society, knowledge of current events, and everyday observation and experience in their scientific aspect. Questions may relate to India and neighbouring countries, especially History, Culture, Geography, Economic Scene, General Policy and Scientific Research.

13.11.5 Computer Knowledge / Proficiency

- **Computer Basics:** Organization of a computer; Central Processing Unit (CPU); input/output devices; computer memory; memory organization; backup devices; ports; Windows Explorer; keyboard shortcuts.
- **Software:** Windows Operating System and basics of Microsoft Office, including MS Word, MS Excel and PowerPoint.
- **Internet and E-mail:** Web browsing and searching; downloading and uploading; managing an e-mail account; e-banking.
- **Networking and Cyber Security:** Networking devices and protocols; network and information security threats such as hacking, viruses, worms and Trojans; preventive measures.
